Driven by the Foster City Tennis Club (FCTC) and supported by the Foster City Parks and Recreation department tennis court usage in Foster City remained at a high level comparing 2019 and 2020 despite the pandemic.

The FCTC is committed to helping the community stay active and to safely participate in tennis activities that contribute to the physical and social well-being of our community.

January 14, 2021, Foster City, CA –The Foster City Tennis Club (FCTC) recently introduced several organized tennis leagues for its members. These new leagues include both social and competitive leagues for men and women. The incentive for the development of these leagues was largely driven by the void left by the suspension of play in the USTA NorCal and the San Francisco Peninsula Tennis Leagues. These leagues have provided organized play for decades and were suspended due to the pandemic.

The FCTC Social Tennis League was launched in August 2020. The Social League is open to men and women members of the FCTC. Play includes women's doubles, men's doubles, women's combo, men's combo, mixed doubles, women's single and men's singles.

The Men's and Women's Competitive Tennis Leagues (CTTL) were established in November 2020. The women's CTTL is open to FCTC members at the 3.0-4.0 USTA level. The initial men's CTTL is open to seniors (60+) at the 3.5-4.0 USTA level. These new leagues were developed in order to maximize member participation. On the horizon are social and competitive programs for higher level and younger players as well as opportunities for family tennis for parents and their kids.

The launch of these new leagues has successfully compensated for the absence of the USTA and SFPTL play. A dive into the metrics demonstrates that court usage in Foster City in Q4 of 2020 was 97% of the level of court usage during Q4 2019 (pre pandemic). Special thanks go to Kacey Karmendy, Terry Hunt and Thom Maslow, Chair, League and Court Committee, Chair, Events Committee and President of the FCTC, respectively. The city of Foster City is to be commended for its steady stewardship and the maintenance of public tennis court facilities in our city,

Foster City Tennis Club's 350 members have hosted USTA adult leagues with hundreds of matches and events on the Foster City tennis courts each year, year around. The club's leadership and members enjoy a decades long-partnership with the City of Foster City staff to provide the community a successful tennis experience.

"We are delighted to have been able to provide a platform for our community to get in safe exercise and socialization by maintaining strong usage of public courts in Foster City.
